What is wrong with the rule?

1. Logistical nightmare for Area Competition organisers resulting in disappointment for members, parents and team managers.
2. Outdated. (a) BD, BSJA, Pony Club (with exception of Championships) and British Driving Society have all abandoned this Rule. (b) Most competitions also run "open" classes on the same day and competitors need not produce flu certificates! Most venues do not impose flu certificate requirements.
3. No flexibility e.g. A competitor with an anomaly in the booster dates years before but subsequent boosters comply still cannot compete despite assurances from vets that they are covered!
