The Foundation was set up in 2006 by one of the UK's leading equine sportsmen, [Emile Faurie](#), to remove one of the barriers to a sport that can enrich the lives of everyone who participates – at whatever level.

We aim to show children how enjoyable and fulfilling equine sports and careers can be, and to help them follow their dreams - developing personal and social skills along the way.

We have currently funded 4 schools across England, and Scotland, with a further 2 being funded during 2009. Our aim is to extend our reach throughout the UK in the run up to the 2012 Olympics.

Schools can send groups of 10 or 12 children each week during term-time, for a course of lessons at selected BHS approved riding establishments. These courses cover the care of the animals, as well as riding instruction and an introduction to the variety of competitive sports involving horses.

The children experience the fun and freedom of horse riding, and gain a real sense of achievement having mastered the challenge of learning to ride or care for the ponies they meet.

- After 3 refusals, elimination but you may continue, giving way to all other riders. Continuing after a fall is up to Judges decision.
- Judges decision is final
- British Riding Club rules will apply.
- Disclaimer of liability- save the death or personal injury caused by negligence of the organisers, or anyone for whom they are in law responsible, neither the organisers nor any agent, employee or representative of these bodies accepts any liability whatsoever while upon the showground or while entering or leaving the same, for any death, injury or loss or damage to any competitor or his or her agent or to any animal, article, plant, machinery or thing bought on to the showground or while entering or leaving or being carried into or out of the said showground. Each competitor shall be responsible for the loss, injury or damage that may be done to or occasioned by, or arising from any animal, article or property, exhibited or brought onto the showground by him and shall indemnify and hold harmless the Rother Valley Riding Club from and against all actions, suits expenses and claims on account or in respect of any such damage or injury which may be caused or occasioned.
